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ECTAC Exceeding Expectations Schools Named for 2025

In 2012, ECTAC launched the Exceeding Expectations Project, an undertaking that identifies high-poverty schools demonstrating exceptional progress in enhancing student achievement for all students.

ECTAC utilized 2024 School Grade Data to identify eligible Award Schools. Out of 3,457 schools with School Grade data, only 43 schools met the initial criteria established by ECTAC and the Exceeding Expectations volunteer Criteria Development Committee.

The <u>Award School criteria</u> encompassed various factors such as:

- Achievement,
- Learning Gains,
- Achievement in ESSA Student Groups/Subgroups*,
- The percentage of Economically Disadvantaged Students.

Criteria were distinguished by school type, including Elementary, Middle, High, and Combination schools.

In addition to the quantitative data, eligible schools submitted a School Success Story Presentation Application for further consideration as an Award School. This additional information served to validate the data and provide a comprehensive understanding of each school's accomplishments.

Based on the 2024 School Grade data and the additional information gathered, ECTAC is pleased to announce the following Award Schools:
